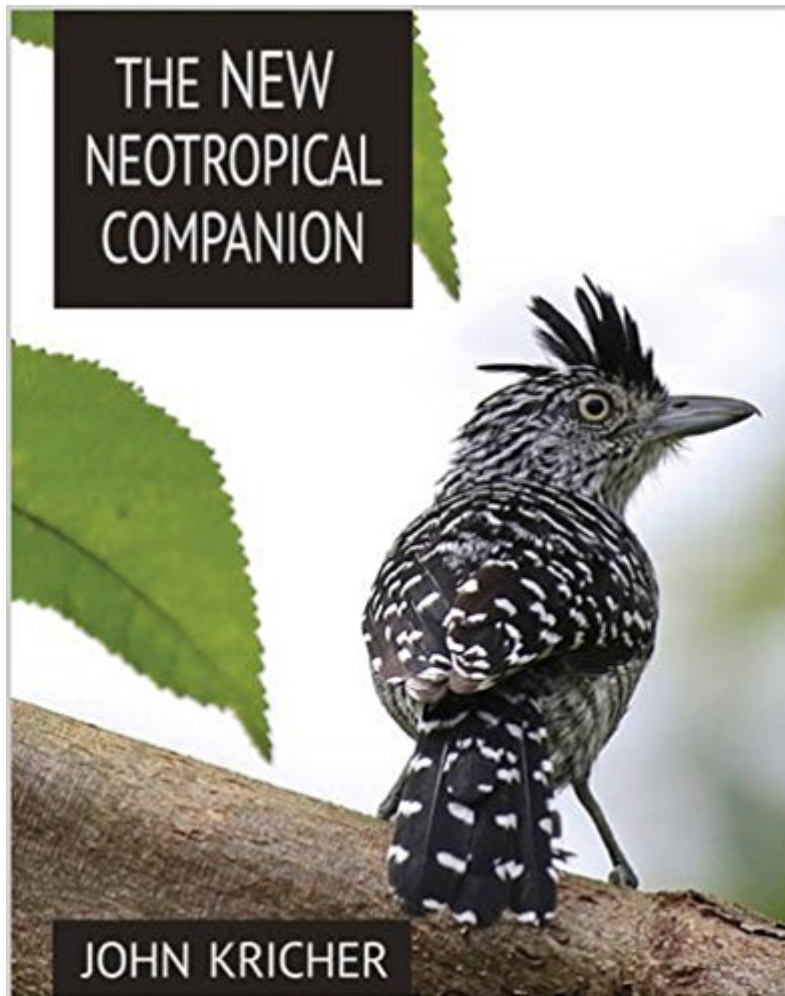




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The New Neotropical Companion

Having long been a devotee of John Kricher's work and his numerous previous productions, it is hardly surprising that I was similarly impressed with the outstandingly colorful and extensively revised newest version of his previous *A Neotropical Companion*. A long-time user of the previous editions - both of which survived extensive trips to the tropics - my only concern about the new volume is that it's almost too handsome to throw in a backpack or a rain forest tent! Despite its large format, the book's completely legible font, brilliant photo images, and Kricher's inimitable sense of humor make this a book to take with you to the tropics. Don't leave it at home! The organization of the text, the extensive bibliography, numerous cross-references, and the carefully selected graphics make the book extremely useful to both first-time visitors to the Neotropics as well as experienced Neotropical travelers. There is hardly a biological theme or an ecological topic that is not touched upon or described in this new and lucid contribution to what is already an extensive Neotropical literature. I heartily recommend this handsome and informative volume for anyone traveling south of the U.S. border, or else simply seeking a fine overview of tropical biology!

I bought this before heading to Ecuador and I'm glad I did. It's a bit heavy but well worth the weight. Very accessible, clearly written, nice balance of background and theory to basic description. It anticipated and answered the questions I would have.

I looked at the Kindle sample and was discouraged when I found several errors and confusions.

Hurricanes are referred to as "anticyclonic rainstorms". Wrong-- they have cyclonic circulation, which is counter-clockwise in the Northern hemisphere. In the next sentence it is stated that hurricanes in the Old World tropics are called "monsoons". Wrong-- the author meant to say typhoons or cyclones. Evapotranspiration is referred to as an adaptation that keeps plants tolerably cool, when it has to do mostly with movement of water from roots up to the leaves and the fact that stomata have to open to admit carbon dioxide. Tropical air rises, it cools and becomes increasingly dense. Moisture condenses, falling as rain. Partial credit: Air parcels do indeed cool as they rise, but they do not become more dense. If they did they wouldn't rise. They become less dense. Whether they rise or fall depends on the density of the surrounding air.

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
