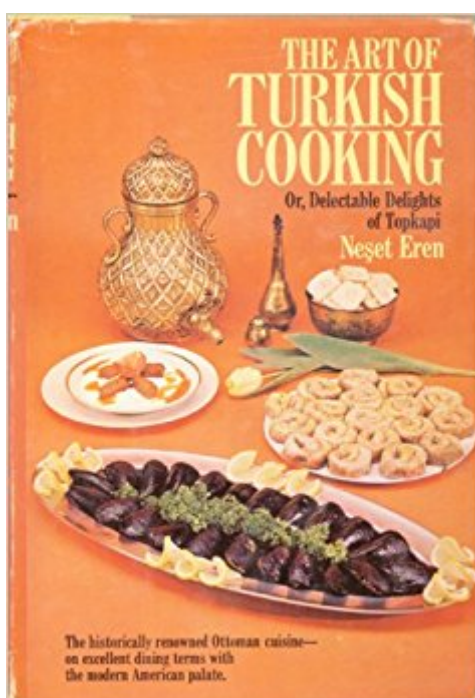

I have used this cookbook since it was published in 1969. I used it while I was living in Turkey, and ever since. Though I have many, many Turkish, Greek, Armenian, Sephardic, Middle Eastern and Eastern European cookbooks, this is the one I rely on most. I use it to vet recipes in other books. It is well written and so far, I've discovered no errors, a too-common occurrence in today's cookbooks. It's true that because of the time Neset Eren's book was written, a number of substitutions are given for foods that are now readily available in the US (English muffins, for example, in lieu of pide), but that doesn't seem important. I have given my daughters-in-law copies, and have three over-used copies of my own. (submitted by 'the wife.')

We've used this book for thirty years, during many years of residence in Turkey. Turks love the food from this book, because of its authenticity. It's written for American cooks, but it makes all the right changes. Highly recommended

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
