Bleach is author Tite Kubo's second title. Kubo made his debut with ZOMBIEPOWDER., a four-volume series for Weekly Shonen Jump. To date, Bleach has been translated into numerous languages and has also inspired an animated TV series that began airing in the U.S. in 2006. Beginning its serialization in 2001, Bleach is still a mainstay in the pages of Weekly Shonen Jump. In 2005, Bleach was awarded the prestigious Shogakukan Manga Award in the shonen (boys) category.

There is no need to talk much about the story, as others here have covered it and you will learn more from researching as opposed to a biased review; however, I will talk about the quality of this manga. The value is obviously quite good, as you get three volumes for about \$12, contrasted to the \$24 with buying the volumes separate. The quality of this 3-in-1 Edition leaves a little something to be desired. The paper is about as thin as wax paper, but this also makes it very easy to read. This means you are able to see pictures through pages when they are laid flat upon one another. Overall this is a very good value, but if you are looking to collect Bleach I would recommend buying separate volumes for a few reasons: 1.) It takes quite some time for these 3-in-1's to be released, so you have to wait longer 2.) The separate volumes are higher quality 3.) You get all of the original cover images (you don't get two of them because of obvious reasons.) Although it is quite expensive to buy them separate... (around \$480 I believe..)

Very good first 3 volumes in one manga. Looks very similar to the Anime version of Bleach. I was hooked onto it and lost track of time while doing laundry during that time of reading over 75 pages worth. Recommend getting this first trilogy volume in one manga for new and beginning manga readers.
