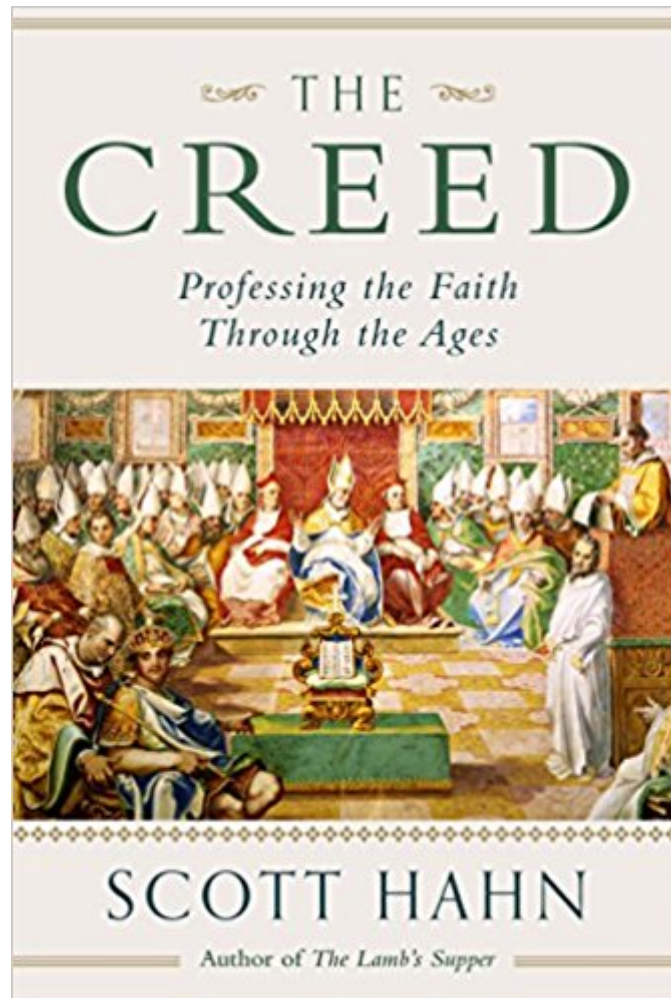

Whether you're just looking to add some depth to your weekly confession of faith, or draining every word of the author's portent, highlighter in one hand, your dog eared reference bible in the other, you will find what you came looking for here. In my opinion the best work Scott has done since his personal epiphany of salvation history that he shared with us all. It begins with a simple forgotten definition of what the word "creed" means, and within a few pages you realize the absurdity of those whom claim to eschew one. In reality we all have a creed, the question here is "is your's authentically christian?"

If I can say one thought about this book - it clearly explains our summary of faith often taken for granted by us Catholics. We have suchba rich faith full of tools, prayers, etc that books like this allow us to appreciate our faith that much more.Well worth reading.
