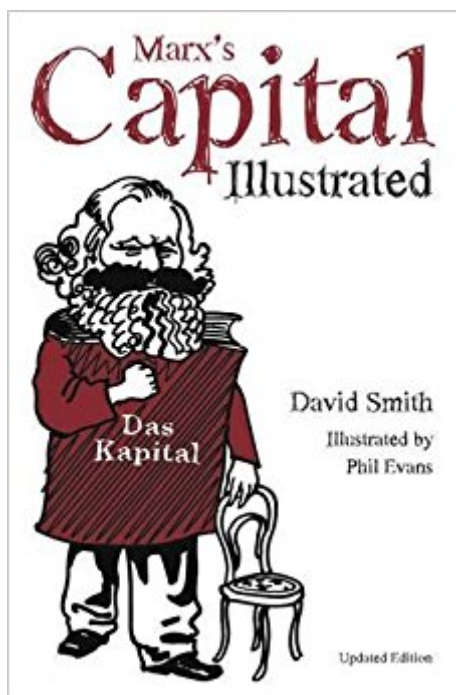

An update on the old Marx for Beginners classic, this amusingly illustrated text might be rather hard for real "beginner beginners" but it does a nice job of explaining the roots of the system of capital and its many crises---with the new edition offering a quick explanation of the most recent financial collapse.. The text is weak on imperialism and the currently emerging world wars, and, from the other angle, there is an unfortunate underestimation of the realities of revolution--why, what, what's next? For that, read Chalmers Johnson's classic, the mainstream's go to---and a cook book for those who favor it. I have the old edition, but am glad to have the new, fresh, edition as well.
